The Concord Township Board met in the Township Office at 121 Grove Street, Concord on Monday, January 13, 2020 for a regularly scheduled meeting.

Members present: Clerk Sheryll Dishaw, Treasurer Judy Clark, Supervisor Al Cavasin, Trustee Naomi Carr and Trustee Jim Bush.

Also present: Kevin Bohl, Edgar Root, Ken Wyatt, Kilbourn Snow, Aaron Losey and Deputy Larry Jacobson.

Supervisor Al Cavasin called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

Trustee Carr honor led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motioned by Cavasin, supported by Bush to approve the December 2019 minutes with the following correction: Ken Wyatt was not present at the meeting. Motion was approved.

Public Comment:

- Ken Wyatt expressed his privilege and honor at being one of the judges for the Light Up Concord contest.
- Edgar Root submitted to the Board a paper concerning vaccinations and a lawsuit that the US Government lost.
- Kilbourn Snow spoke about getting the government class at the school involved in discussions on how Concord should evolve in the future, also about getting the school board and village board to attend a Planning Commission meeting to discuss future developments for the Master Plan.

Clerk Dishaw submitted the monthly bills in the amount of \$24,795.49. Motioned by Clark, seconded by Carr to approve the payment of the bills. Motion was approved.

Reports:

- Treasurer Clark gave the financial conditional of the Township; revenues for December were \$25,845.27 and expenditures were \$22,131.99. The General Fund balance was \$222,675.86.
- Trustee Bush gave the December 2019 Fire Board Report. Runs for November consisted of 27 runs total (12 in the Township, 11 in the Village, 2 Mutual Aids and 2 training). Total of bills including payroll was \$4440.36. Balance for Stabilization Fund as of December 31st was \$137,614.73. Gear that was damaged in the accident on N. Concord Road was being ordered. The new rescue has been placed in operation. Supervisor Cavasin wanted Trustee Bush to relay to Chief Mosher how impressed he is with the Chief's fiscal handling of the department.
- Deputy Jacobson gave the December 2019 Police Report. Total Dispatches were 44; with 14 in the Village, 20 in the Township and 10 Out of Area/Backup

calls. He also presented the recent Concord Blotter filled with information about an incident involving a student who threw a water bottle at the back of a school bus, a group of students involved in a fight with students from Springport High School, a stolen RV trailer that turned out not to be stolen, a fight between two men at the Concord PS Food Mart, a stolen vehicle and his assistance to multiple departments concerning various car thefts.

 Trustee Carr gave the January 2020 Planning Commission Report. Discussion was held on allow tiny homes and getting Concord school students involved in the workings of the Township.

The reports were approved by consent.

Unfinished Business: None.

New Business:

- With the Presidential Primary being held on March 10th which is in the middle of Board of Review week the Board of Review meeting dates need to be changed. Motioned by Cavasin, supported by Clark to change the March Board of Review dates to Wednesday, March 11th 3 pm to 9 pm and Thursday, March 12th from 9 am to 3 pm. Motion was approved.
- Motioned by Dishaw, supported by Clark to approve the new land division application. Motion was carried.

Board Member comments:

- Bush none.
- Clark Would like to see the High School government class observe the election process on March 10th.
- Dishaw MTA 2020 Capital Conference is on February 26th at a cost of \$30 per attendee. Treasurer Clark, Trustee Carr and Planning Commission member Bohl would like to attend.
- Carr Expressed interest in attending the Annual MTA conference in April, as well as Treasurer Clark.

ASSESSING DEPARTMENT REPORT

The assessing department completed 299 site inspections in 2019. 195 of them were in the residential class, 58 agricultural class, 40 commercial (which includes a canvas of personal property) and 3 industrial.

The CPI for 2020 is 1.019, which is slightly lower than last's year 1.024. However, even though it is lower than last year, it still is an increase in the taxable value. The CPI is received from the State of Michigan, which is based on the cost of living per federal guidelines.

Per the County's Equalization analyses, the assessment of the township properties have to be changed approximately by:

Agricultural class an increase of 6%%, an increase of 8%, Industrial class Residential class an increase of .016%, an increase of 5%.

These changes are for the classes as a whole and affect assessed values, not taxable values. Individual parcels will increase or decrease depending on their own particular circumstances.

Due to sales, tillable land increased as well as rural residential land and land in the Village of Concord. Most of the economic condition factors (difference between cost manual and actual sales) went up, which is why each classes' values had to increase.

The assessed and taxable values have increased over last year, with the tentative assessed value including personal property \$126,307,800 (difference of \$7,678,200) and the tentative taxable value \$83,809,251 (difference of \$3,369,455) but the numbers won't be finalized until after the March Board of Review.

The March Board of Review will meet on Wednesday, March 11th from 3 pm to 9 pm and on Thursday, March 12th from 9 am to 3 pm in the Concord Township Office. Once again appointments are being scheduled with walk-ins to be seen between scheduled times. Change notices will be mailed by February 26th.
